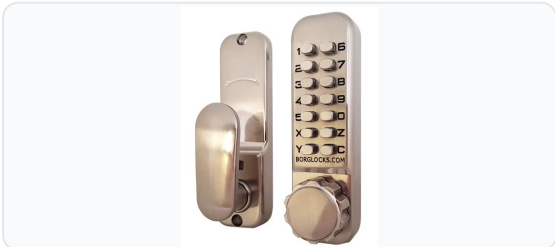

Product Description

The BL2501 falls under our codestar range, acting as a heavier duty lock compared with the other BL2000 series. This comes with fully stainless steel interiors and an intumescent pack, designed for use with either a 30 minute or a 60 minute fire door.

This comes with a 60mm tubular latch.

Independent successful fire resistance test was carried out by BM Trada for 30 and 60 minutes in accordance with BS EN1634-1 and BS EN1363-1. Each fire tested kit comes fully supplied with the required stainless steel fittings and intumescent kits to keep it fully in accordance with the required certification.

The BL2501 falls under our Codestar range of mechanical push button locks. Manufactured to the highest standard with premium components, these are typically made from stainless steel to guarantee longevity.

With it being cycle tested to 100,000 cycles to show it's durability, this lock represents the medium tier of small, mechanical keypad locks. This keypad comes with over 8000 potential combinations.

This lock comes with a anti-thrust tubular latch that comes in three different sizes: the 50mm, the 60mm and 70mm backsets.

As an added extra, this unit can come with a holdback function as required at no additional cost for situations where the door needs to remain open and unlocked.

This is suited for wooden and composite doors both internally and sheltered external applications.

Borg (trading as **Borg Locks**) is a UK access-control brand best known for **mechanical, keyless push-button door and gate locks**: the classic “no batteries, no wiring, just a code” approach that’s popular for shared doors, staff entrances, plant rooms, gates, and anywhere keys inevitably get lost, copied, or ceremonially dropped down a drain.

Borg has been **designing, creating, and distributing mechanical access-control devices since 1997**, with a product line built around different duty levels and environments - from light internal use to heavy-duty commercial traffic.

The range is deliberately broad and application-led: Borg markets keypad locks for **timber doors, steel doors, aluminium doors, gates**, plus specialist lines like **fire-tested keypads** and **marine-grade/weather-resistant** options for exposed installations.

A big “Borg-ism” you’ll see repeatedly is **easy code management** - for example their **Easicode Pro (ECP)** range is designed for **on-the-door code changes** without removing the lock (useful for rentals, staff turnover, site access, etc.).
