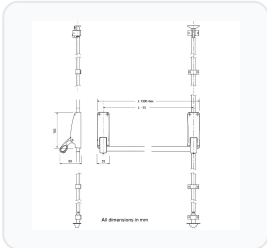
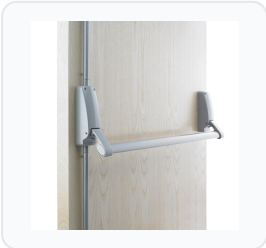

Product Description

The Briton 376E Single Panic Bolt is a highly reliable, surface-mounted push bar exit device designed to provide safe and easy egress in an emergency. Suitable for use on single doors and non-rebated double doors, this two-point locking panic bolt features a reversible design (self-handed) and is ideal for public buildings where users may not be familiar with the exit routes.

Constructed with durability in mind, the 376E features adjustable top and bottom shoots, along with a tubular steel cross bar and shoots that can be conveniently cut on-site to fit the exact dimensions of your door. Security is enhanced by an integrated anti-thrust device, which prevents unauthorised forced retraction of the latch bolts from the outside, and an automatic top catch that holds the bolts securely in place when the door is closed. It has been rigorously tested in excess of 200,000 cycles and is fire tested to EN 1634 for up to 2 hours on timber doors.

Today, **Briton is part of Allegion** (the global security group behind multiple access and door hardware brands). In the Allegion portfolio, Briton sits as a specialist name for door control and emergency exit solutions.

What Briton is typically associated with in the trade/spec world:

- **Overhead door closers** (including their long-running “classic” closer heritage)
- **Panic and emergency exit devices** such as push bars and push pads, designed and tested to standards like **EN 1125** (panic) and **EN 179** (emergency exit) depending on application
- A broader ecosystem that now extends into related **locks, cylinders, door furniture and accessories** under the Briton hallmark
