The Briton 4200 Series Mitred Lever on Rose (4204.19.SS) combines contemporary aesthetics with exceptional durability, making it an ideal choice for both commercial and residential projects. Precision manufactured from high-grade 304 stainless steel in a satin finish, this stylish straight mitred lever handle features a 19mm diameter round bar prefixed to an 8mm thick sprung rose.

Engineered for high-traffic environments, these robust handles are tested to EN 1906 Grade 7 durability (200,000 cycles) and offer Grade 3 corrosion resistance. They are fully fire-tested to EN 1634, offering up to 2 hours of protection on timber fire doors and up to 4 hours on steel fire doors. The set is supplied as a pair, complete with an 8mm spindle and M4 bolt-through fixings to suit doors between 38mm and 54mm thick, and features push-on rose covers to conceal all fixings for a clean, professional finish.

Briton is a long-established UK door hardware brand best known for **door controls** and **exit hardware** used in commercial buildings where reliability and fire-safety compliance actually matter. Briton markets itself as having **over 100 years** of history in the sector, with a reputation built on “highly engineered” products designed to survive constant, unglamorous punishment in busy environments.

Today, **Briton is part of Allegion** (the global security group behind multiple access and door hardware brands). In the Allegion portfolio, Briton sits as a specialist name for door control and emergency exit solutions.

What Briton is typically associated with in the trade/spec world:

- **Overhead door closers** (including their long-running “classic” closer heritage)
- **Panic and emergency exit devices** such as push bars and push pads, designed and tested to standards like **EN 1125** (panic) and **EN 179** (emergency exit) depending on application
- A broader ecosystem that now extends into related **locks, cylinders, door furniture and accessories** under the Briton hallmark
