EVVA is an Austrian, **family-owned** security manufacturer based in **Vienna**, specialising in high-end **mechanical and electronic locking systems** for everything from homes to large, complex master-keyed organisations. The company was **founded in Vienna in 1919**, and it still runs **research, development, and production** from its Vienna headquarters, exporting globally.

In the trade/spec world, EVVA's reputation is built on **serious key control** and **master key system engineering**—locks designed not just to resist attack, but to keep access hierarchies manageable at scale (offices, hospitals, residential complexes, universities, etc.).

A couple of EVVA's standout mechanical platforms get referenced constantly:

- **ICS (Inner Code System)** – a reversible key system aimed at **highly complex master key structures**, with EVVA citing long patent protection (into the 2030s, depending on jurisdiction).
- **MCS (Magnetic Code System)** – EVVA positions this as a top-tier system for sophisticated master keying, with a strong anti-copying story (including resistance to modern replication methods).

They also explicitly brand themselves around innovation: EVVA talks about holding **200+ patents** and frames its history as “start-up energy since 1919” (which is an absolutely deranged sentence for a century-old lock company, but I respect the audacity).
